

## Tips For Using Your Visor Card

- ◆ Keep this card in your overhead visor in the event you are pulled over by law enforcement
- ◆ When you are pulled over, remove the visor card from the visor and hold in your hand while keeping both hands on the steering wheel
- ◆ Do not attempt to move in any manner that would make the officer suspect you have a weapon
- ◆ Roll your driver side window down and wait for the officer to approach, then show the officer the visor card
- ◆ If you are not able to understand what is being said through written notes, request an Interpreter or another effective means of communication

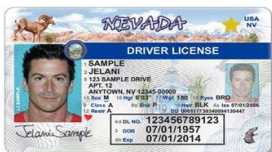
# DRIVER IS DEAF

- ◆ For simple communication writing notes may help

- ◆ Qualified Interpreter(s) must be provided upon request to ensure effective communication (see 504 Rehab. Act/Title II of ADA).
