## COMPARISONS AT A GLANCE

Service animal – means any dog or miniature horse individually trained to do work and/or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability.

**Emotional support animal** – are animals that provide comfort and support in forms of affection and companionship for an individual with various mental and/or emotional conditions.

Therapy animal – is an animal, usually a dog that is trained to provide affection, comfort, and love to people in hospitals, retirement homes, nursing homes, disaster areas, etc.

Companion animal – is an animal, usually a dog that does not "work" by doing specific tasks for a person with a disability, but instead provides companionship for an individual with or without a disability.
