Re: Investigation of the State of Nevada

Dear Ms. Bigley:

The Department of Justice has completed its investigation into the Nevada Disability Advocacy & Law Center's July 24, 2020 complaint alleging that Nevada violates the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) by unnecessarily institutionalizing children with behavioral health conditions, or putting them at risk of institutionalization. Our investigation was conducted under Title II of the ADA, 42 U.S.C. §§ 12131-12134, and the ADA's implementing regulations, 28 C.F.R. Part 35.

After carefully reviewing the evidence, we conclude that there is reasonable cause to believe that the State of Nevada violates the ADA by failing to provide services to children with behavioral health disabilities in the most integrated setting appropriate to their needs. The enclosed Report sets out the Department's findings, as well as the minimum remedial measures we believe may remedy the alleged violations.

We will seek to obtain the State's compliance with the ADA by voluntary means, but if that is unsuccessful, we may pursue other appropriate action. If you wish to take other action on your complaint, you may file a private suit at any time. 28 C.F.R. § 35.172(d).
